#### 1.2 Notational conventions

This manual uses the following notational conventions:

**Letterings** The letterings for connectors and controls are marked by square brackets and italics.

**Examples:** [VOLUME] control, [Mono] button.

**Displays**Texts and values displayed on the device are marked by quotation marks and italics.

Examples: '24ch', 'OFF'.



#### Instructions

The individual steps of an instruction are numbered consecutively. The result of a step is indented and highlighted by an arrow.

#### **Example:**

- **1.** Switch on the device.
- **2.** Press [Auto].
  - $\Rightarrow$  Automatic operation is started.
- **3.** Switch off the device.

# 1.3 Symbols and signal words

In this section you will find an overview of the meaning of symbols and signal words that are used in this manual.

Signal word	Meaning
DANGER!	This combination of symbol and signal word indicates an immediate dangerous situation that will result in death or serious injury if it is not avoided.
NOTICE!	This combination of symbol and signal word indicates a possible dangerous situation that can result in mate- rial and environmental damage if it is not avoided.
Warning signs	Type of danger







#### **Rear panel connections**



10 [USB]

Use the included USB cable to connect the USB port on the rear panel of the MIDI keyboard to the USB port of a computer.

Besides the data transmission, this interface also provides the power supply to the MIDI keyboard.

11 [MIDI OUT]

Use a MIDI cable to connect the MIDI port on the rear panel of the MIDI keyboard to the MIDI port of a sound module.

At MIDI connections, the device that controls other devices, is referred to as the 'Master'. A device that is controlled via MIDI is called 'Slave'. Connect the MIDI OUT of the master to the MIDI IN of the slave. You can not connect the MIDI OUT of a device to the MIDI IN of the same device.

12 [PEDAL]

Socket to connect a volume or sustain pedal, e.g.



## 5 Functions

#### Setting the touch sensitivity

Proceed as follows to adjust the touch sensitivity:

- 1. Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- Repeatedly press [VELOCITY CURVE] until the desired value is shown in the display. Value range: normal 'nor', soft 'SoF', hard 'hAr', 'F-1', 'F-2', 'F-3'.
- **3.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### Setting the volume

Use the slider to set the volume [VOLUME]. The slider can also be assigned to another MIDI command.

#### **Octave transposing**

With the arrow buttons [OCTAVE] you can transpose the pitch of the entire keyboard up to three octaves up or down. The display shows the selected level ('-03'...'0'... '03') and the corresponding arrow key lights up red simultaneously when octave shifting.

#### **Transposing**

Simultaneously press [EDIT] along with one of the arrow buttons [OCTAVE] to transpose the entire keyboard in semitones up or down. The current value appears in the display ('-12'... '0'... '12').

#### Pitch bending

Use the Pitchbend wheel to vary the pitch up or down while playing. How many semitones can be pitch bended up or down depends on the tone generator used.

#### Modulation

The function of the modulation wheel depends on the tone generator used. Usually, this controls the intensity of a vibrato effect.

Proceed as follows to assign another MIDI CC to the modulation wheel.

- 1. Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- 2. Press [ASSIGN MOD].
  - ⇒ The currently set value is shown in the display.
- **3.**  $\triangleright$  Enter the desired value ('1' ... '127') via the numeric keys.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### MIDI bank assignment

Proceed as follows to assign the MIDI bank:

- **1.** Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** Press [MSB] ([LSB]).
  - ⇒ The currently set value is shown in the display.
- **3.** Enter the desired value ('1' ... '127') via the numeric keys.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.



#### **Programme change**

Proceed as follows to send Programme Change commands

- 1. Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** Press [*PROG*].
  - ⇒ The currently set value is shown in the display.
- **3.**  $\triangleright$  Enter the desired value ('1' ... '127') via the numeric keys.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### MIDI channel assignment

Proceed as follows to assign the MIDI channel:

- **1.** Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** Press [CHANNEL].
  - ⇒ The currently set value is shown in the display.
- **3.**  $\triangleright$  Enter the desired value ('1'...'16') via the numeric keys.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### Storing a preset

Proceed as follows to store a preset:

- 1. Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** Press [PRESET STORE].
  - ⇒ The display shows 'Sto'.
- **3.** Use the numeric keys to enter a value between '1' ... '9'.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### Loading a preset

Proceed as follows to load a preset:

- **1.** Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** ▶ Press [PRESET LOAD].
  - $\Rightarrow$  The display shows 'Lod'.
- **3.** Use the numeric keys to enter a value between '1' ... '9'.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.



#### **Fader function**

Proceed as follows to set the fader function:

- 1. Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** Press [ASSIGN FADER].
  - ⇒ The currently set value is flashing in the display.
- **3.**  $\triangleright$  Enter the desired value ('1' ... '127') via the numeric keys.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### **Pedal function**

Proceed as follows to set the pedal function:

- **1.** Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** Press [ASSIGN PEDAL].
  - ⇒ The currently set value is flashing in the display.
- **3.**  $\triangleright$  Enter the desired value ('1' ... '127') via the numeric keys.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### **Encoder**

Proceed as follows to set the encoder:

- 1. Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- 2. Press [ASSIGN KNOB].
  - ⇒ The currently set value is flashing in the display.
- **3.** Enter the desired value ('1' ... '127') via the numeric keys.
- **4.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **5.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### All notes off (Panic function)

Proceed as follows to turn all notes off:

- **1.** Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- **2.** Press [ALL NOTES OFF].
- **3.** Confirm with [ENTER].
- **4.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### **MIDI** reset command

Proceed as follows to reset the MIDI settings:

- **1.** Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.
- 2. Press [RESET ALL].
- **3.** ▶ Confirm the input with [ENTER].
- **4.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.



## **Reset to factory defaults**

Proceed as follows to reset the MIDI settings:

**1.** Press [EDIT] to activate the Edit mode.

**2.** Press [DEFAULT].

**3.** Confirm the input with [ENTER].

**4.** Press [EDIT] to leave the Edit mode.

#### **Troubleshooting**

Problem	Possible causes and solutions
No power supply	Check the USB cable for proper connection. Connect the MIDI keyboard via the supplied USB cable to a computer for power supply.
No sound when pressing keys	Check hard and software for volume settings: Computer, sound module, connected speakers.
	Check MIDI ports and speaker cables for proper connection.
	Check channel settings.
	Check sequencer settings.
	Correct settings if necessary and / or establish connections correctly.
Continuous tone	Toggle the sustain pedal polarity (if possible).
	Try disconnecting the sustain pedal.
	Check the MIDI filter settings on the tone generator or in the software.
	Reset the keyboard with [RESET ALL] or [ALL NOTES OFF] .
Wrong sounds	Check the settings of the software sequencer or sound module, restart / initialize if necessary.
No sound selection possible	Check the settings of MSB and LSB, the software sequencer or sound module, restart / initialize if necessary.
Wrong pitch	Reset the transposed or octaved keyboard.
	Reset the active MIDI pitch.
Function not available	Check hardware configuration and connections, connect cables correctly, replace defective components.
	Missing, defective or unsupported drivers and / or software. Install correct driver, update software.

The troubleshooting information does not claim to be complete.



# 6 MIDI implementation chart

#### What is MIDI?

MIDI stands for 'Musical Instrument Digital Interface' and represents the standard interface between a computer and electronic instruments. You can use the USB connection to exchange MIDI data with computers.

The MIDI keyboard can be connected to a computer (via USB) and to a sound module (via MIDI).
